Guidance with Sisterly Love: Mentorship Program 2013

After the well-received pilot run in 2010, our association is going to officially launch a biennial mentorship program that pairs up participating students with respectable alumnae-mentors that share similar interests or possess relevant knowledge.

Outstanding All-Rounder Scholarship 2012



Reflection from Natasha Hong, The 2012 Outstanding All Rounder



Before sharing my experience and what I have learnt in the All-rounder award organized by the Alumnae Association, I would like to ask a question. Have you ever wondered why the Apple logo is an apple with a bite but not an intact one?

Well, the former CEO of Apple, Steve Jobs, once explained his concept in designing the unique trademark in line with his belief of 'Stay hungry, stay foolish'. He said that we should acknowledge our littleness and be humble, thirst for knowledge and learn different skills as if we were beginners. His learning approach and attitude can be applied on the Outstanding All-Rounder Scholarship interview as well.

When I typed 'all-round' in the search engine, many results concurred that one should be competent in every aspect such as

sports, art, academic, leadership, community services, etc. However, according to my experience, one of the adjudicators in the scholarship interview, Ms Anne Anita Cheung, told us that it is not reasonable to expect an all-rounder to excel in all aspects. What is more important is that we need to understand our strengths and acknowledge our shortcomings, and demonstrate how we make good use of our talents and overcome our weaknesses. This is essential in the process of pursuing excellence. Just like iPhone, although it is very convenient to the users, it still has a lot of deficiencies. For example, it is criticized that the battery deteriorates quickly; the browsing speed on the internet is rather slow, etc. The Apple company, while keeping the strengths of the existing model, improve on the shortcomings

and introduce new functions in every new generation of iPhone. It is only after repeated failures and improvement that the smart phone on our hands can have comprehensive functions. I understand myself more when preparing the Outstanding All-Rounder Scholarship application form and organizing my resume. The training workshop and interview equipped me with practical interview skills which are also essential life skills. After the demanding interview, the experienced adjudicators provided me with professional and critical comment which enlightened me to a great extent. All these are precious learning opportunities that we, as proactive teenagers, should not neglect. Take the initiative and capture them!
